I am hearing some buzz around ULC about the new digital sign the church council decided to forward to you at the annual meeting. Where did this come from? It was a bit of an accident. As I was speaking about our 75th anniversary as a congregation in Grand Forks, I wondered aloud with the church council what kinds of projects we could do together as a way of celebrating this important year. One of the things I mentioned in passing was a digital sign. Why? Perhaps I had just been outside changing our current sign, which is definitely no picnic. But actually, I have no idea why it came to mind.

Well, over a couple of meetings this idea came to life, so we met with Nick from Indigo Signs, received the bid, and before long, we, the Church Council, kind of loved the idea. However, now it is up to you, the people of ULC, to decide. To be honest, I am glad for all the buzz, that is healthy. We should care a lot about our shared ministry and feel comfortable talking about such matters and raising questions. Of course, if the answer to this idea is "no", everything will be fine and ministry will continue at ULC as best as we can, but I really encourage you to think about more than the cost of the project.

There is no doubt the \$30,000 price tag is a lot of money. However, if that is the only downside, then perhaps consider some of the upside. After all, such a sign is outreach, even evangelism. Through its words and images, we will be inviting people to worship, Bible studies, Church School, Rhubarb Festival, concerts, Christmas and Easter services, like never before. When people drive by ULC on Drive-Thru Prayer days, we will be a lot easier to notice and harder to ignore. This is to say nothing of all the positive statements, invitations, and Gospel messages we can share with our community.

The city estimates at least 1.7 million cars drive by ULC each year. Add to this the countless numbers of bikers and pedestrians who pedal and walk by, and maybe we are talking 2 million or more. The potential for people noticing ULC and participating seems greatly improved. This is no panacea, but it would be our intentional effort to stand out, and hopefully our ministry would stand out as brightly as the sign. In the end, it is our congregation saying, "We are here, come and join us," and hopefully what follows is that we are drawing people to the Lord Jesus Christ as much as we are drawing them to us.

The sign would be a luxury to be sure. Maybe we feel like we are not large enough ministry for such a thing. Certainly, this is not as important as was our remodeling last year, but it could become important for us. On my part, this is not a "must do" project, although, like most the members of the council I think I would be disappointed. At any rate, make sure and ask any questions you want at the meeting. Speak out your thoughts without worry about being judged. We are a family, and I hope we care enough about each other to listen. Plus, if you want a silent vote, someone just needs to ask.

I also am hoping to present several other ideas for our 75th year as a congregation. For example, concerts in the spring, summer, and fall with the community invited. A fundraising effort to raise \$7,500 for the food cupboard. A worship and picnic in the park next summer with the community invited. A Christmas party next December for



intellectually challenged people. Of course, a fall event to celebrate the year. We can do all of these, some of these, none of these, or more than these. I am simply imagining a year where we stand out in this community and beyond. Perhaps a new digital sign can help.

I am intrigued with Jesus' words from Matthew 5:16, "Let your light shine before others, so that they see your good works and give glory to your Father in heaven." It makes me wonder: How are ULC and its people shining lights in the world? How might ULC and its people be shining lights for the community of Grand Forks in 2025 as we celebrate our 75th year? Does purchasing and installing a brightly lit digital sign along University Avenue help us make our lights shine? We are free to disagree on this last question, but we are compelled by Jesus to answer the first two, and then together to shine!

ULC Annual Meeting February 9, 2025

Please join us for the Annual Meeting of University Lutheran Church, **Sunday**, **February 9, 2025, 11:30am**. We will hear ministry reports, consider old and new business, have a few elections, and consider our 2025 budget.

The Church Council has voted to purchase a **new digital sign** for the corner of University Avenue and 21st Street. It would be the same size as our current sign with a resolution of 6mm, and of course, it would be mounted on our current brick edifice. Please check out the display relating to this sign in the narthex. All questions are good questions and welcome!

The cost of the new sign is **\$29,263**. This includes the removal of the existing sign, the digital sign itself, installation, 5-year parts warranty, 2-year labor warranty, and software training. The only costs not covered are the cost of the sign permit from the city and the electrical connection. The council is asking you to approve a **maximum of \$35,000** for the project.

Feed My Starving Children -Mission of the Month



During January, February, and March, ULC will raise funds for our community's FMSC MobilePack event on April 10-12. Our **Mission Endowment has already set aside \$2,000**, and the coins and dollars given at our NoisyOffering during these three months will likely double that number. Please stay tuned for other FMSC fundraising opportunities.

It is our goal as a community to pack 400,000 meals, and we have already raised \$54,270 of the \$117,500 that we need to pay for the event. Each 29 cents raised provides a meal for a hungry child. That means a gift of \$30 pays for 103 meals, a gift of \$50 pays for 172 meals, and a gift of \$100 pays for 344 meals. What a wonderful way to serve hungry children!

Fun fact: Did you know that Feed My Starving Children has prepared **4,428,925,866** for hungry and starving children in our world.








Crafting With Christ



Treasurer's Report: Approved

Pastor's Report: Annual meeting is February 9. Light post in the parking lot is out and working on getting that repaired. Motion to increase annual giving to the Synod by \$1000 was approved.

Old Business:

- The Wheels to Worship van is ready to provide rides. We continue to talk about the best ways to encourage use of rides to and from worship.
- The proposed new digital sign will be discussed at the annual meeting. Council members will speak with neighbors to let them know we are considering this addition.
- We discussed the need to fill an open council position.

New Business:

- Missionary Sponsorship, ELCA: Motion made to increase giving from \$500 to \$1,000 approved.
- Isaac Strom, Chi Alpha Mission Trip: Motion made to give \$500 to support Isaac's trip, from the Misc. Memorial Fund.
- 2025 Budget: 2025 budget was reviewed and approved by the council. The 2025 budget will be presented at the Annual Meeting for final approval.

Ministry Reports:

Education: Focusing on attendance and participation, rewarding the kids for their efforts with the hope it will re-energize the kids, and keep them excited to come.

Property: The fan in the men's bathroom is likely to be nearing its end of life. We will keep an eye on it and replace once necessary.

Worship: New signage being placed on the front door with a reminder that those doors will be locked shortly after worship begins. The parking lot door can be used during this time. This year is our 75th Anniversary and several ways to celebrate are being discussed. Some initial thoughts are a picnic in the park this summer and a celebration at the church sometime in the fall. Other events will be planned as well.


