

Is prayer an important part of your life? It's a very personal question. When I ask confirmation students this, I get all sorts of answers. Some say they don't pray much or at all. Some say they pray before meals, especially the evening meal. Some say they pray before tests, concerts, musicals, and all sorts of sporting events. Some say they pray when they are struggling at difficult times in their lives. I imagine if I asked a group of adults the same question the answers might be more similar than different. One thing for sure, prayer is a habit and discipline that if we don't practice it, we won't do it.

Jesus is recorded as praying about 25 times in the New Testament. There are many situations where we see him praying. Here are some examples: We see him praying at special occasions like his baptism. We see him praying in times of great emotional distress like in the Garden of Gethsemane. We see him praying before making a big decision like the night before he chose his 12 disciples. We see him praying before a big miracle like he did at the raising of Lazarus. We see him praying for other people like in John 17 when he prayed first for the disciples, and second for people of all times and places.


But I treasure this verse from Mark 1:35 most: "Very early in the morning, while it was still dark, Jesus got up, left the house and went off to a solitary place, where he prayed." Here we get a fascinating glimpse of the prayer life of our Lord Jesus Christ. Jesus obviously prayed with others, but there were times when he needed to get away to a quiet place to be alone with God and pray. This is why I chose, "Be Still & Know That I Am God," for our Lenten theme this year. It is my hope our six-week series on the Lord's Prayer will tempt you to slow down and seek God in quiet places through prayer.

What about the Lord's prayer? Well, it seems like Jesus' disciples saw his habit of seeking quiet places to pray to God, and they wanted to know more about what he was doing. Being naturally curious, they asked him to teach them how to pray. It's possible that Jesus said a lot of things to his disciples about prayer, but the response to their request that is recorded in Matthew (6: 9-13) and Luke (11:2-4), are the words of what we call the Lord's Prayer. Apparently, Jesus felt the words of this form prayer were good for teaching both his disciples and people in general, the best practices when it comes to prayer.

Form prayers are made up of predetermined words and phrases that are meant to be easy to remember, so they can be spoken to God throughout a person's day. For example, one such form prayer is, "Come, Lord Jesus, be our guest, and let these gifts to us be blessed. Amen." This is an easy to remember prayer that can be spoken to God out loud or under your breath anytime and anywhere you are eating. While other prayers may be spontaneous and informal, form prayers are structured and formal. They rarely ever change, and so they make great tools for teaching people how to pray.

We will study the Lord's Prayer this way during our Wednesday Lenten services. Since Jesus offered this form prayer as a way of teaching his disciples to pray, we will examine it as way to teach us how to pray, or equally important, to refresh our understanding of what it means to pray. This prayer is from the mouth of our Lord Jesus Christ, Son of God, so it seems wise to pray it often, perhaps even twice a day, and to study it for the purpose of increasing our understanding

of prayer. Hopefully this study will help us all to be still before God our Father with our own spontaneous prayers.



In the end, prayer is simply our day-to-day conversation with the Lord. It is the time we spend speaking and listening to the God who loves us. As we move through Lent, why don't you consider spending ten minutes a day in a quiet place with the Lord, focusing on such conversations. Ten minutes may seem like a lot to some and not enough for others, but however much time you spend alone with the Lord, I believe you will be blessed because you did. Speak freely to the Lord, both the good things and the hard things of your life, and don't forget to listen too. You just never know what God might say.

Wednesdays in Lent

Wednesday Lenten Theme - "Be Still & Know That I Am God"

Wednesday midweek worship this Lenten season will focus on the Lord's Prayer in a series entitled, "Be Still & Know That I Am God". In this series, we will remember Jesus' disciples asked him to teach them how to pray. Jesus responded to their request by sharing the words of what we call, "The Lord's Prayer". So, on the six Wednesday evenings in the season of Lent, we will focus our attention on six ideas about prayer from the Lord's Prayer that Jesus likely considered very important. At the same time, we will encourage each other to take time in our lives to seek quiet places where we can "be still" in the presence of God and pray.

Each Wednesday worship in Lent will also include parts of Marty Haugen's Holden Evening Prayer liturgy, **fun take homes for children**, a sung version of the Lord's Prayer, Holy Communion, as well as a suggestion of food items for you to bring for the Salvation Army Food Pantry.

"Talking With Your Abba"

Our Father who art in heaven
Bring canned fruit for the Food Pantry

Week 2: March 12

"Someone to Treasure"

Hallowed be thy name

Bring canned vegetables for the Food Pantry

Week 3: March 19

"Help Us! It's Bad Down Here"

Thy kingdom come; thy will be done on earth as it is in heaven Bring canned soup for the Food Pantry

Week 4: March 26

"God Will Take Care of You"

Give us this day our daily bread

Bring spaghetti sauce and noodles and/or macaroni and cheese for the Food Pantry

Week 5: April 2

"Christians and the Confessional"

And forgive us our trespasses as we forgive those who trespass against us Bring boxed cereals for the Food Pantry

Week 6: April 9

"Jesus Versus Evil"

Lead us not into temptation, but deliver us from evil Bring boxed desserts for the Food Pantry



Ash Wednesday- March 5

Sunday worship this Lent will focus on the theme, "In God We Trust". Of course, this "trust" is inscribed on our US currency, whether Americans believe it or not. However, as followers of the Lord Jesus Christ, we believe God has inscribed this trust on our hearts. Instead, Lent is a season to remember even though we are broken people who are at times far removed from God, that God through worship, community, and prayer, can awaken the trust he has inscribed on our hearts. Then once again, our sins are forgiven, and our lives are renewed.





Feed My Starving Children - Mission of the Month

During January, February, and March, ULC is raising funds for our community's FMSC MobilePack event on April 10-12. Our Mission Endowment has already set aside \$2,000, and the coins and dollars given at our Noisy Offering in January was \$579. We are continuing to designate our Noisy Offerings in February and March for our FMSC packing event as well.

It is our goal as a community to pack 400,000 meals, and we have already raised \$67,369 of the \$117,500 that we need to pay for the event. Each 29 cents raised provides a meal for a hungry child. That means a gift of \$30 pays for 103 meals, a gift of \$50 pays for 172 meals, and a gift of \$100 pays for 344 meals. What a wonderful way to serve hungry children!

Fun fact: Did you know that Feed My Starving Children has prepared 4,428,925,866 for hungry and starving children in our world.


